Dear Secretary Reese:

In accordance with 18 CFR § 16.6 and Section 15 of the Federal Power Act, Northern California Power Agency (NCPA), Licensee of the Collierville and Spicer Meadow (FERC No. 11197) Transmission Line Project (Project or Transmission Lines), is hereby electronically filing with the Commission a Notice of Intent to File a License Application (NOI) and a Pre-Application Document (PAD) for the relicensing of said Project. The current license for the Project expires on January 31, 2032.

In accordance with the Commission's regulations, NCPA hereby declares its unequivocal intent to begin the relicensing process for the Project by filing the enclosed Notice of Intent to file an application for a subsequent license for the Project. Along with the NOI, a PAD that includes information for the Project is also enclosed.

In accordance with 18 CFR § 5.5(c), the Licensee is providing a copy of the NOI and PAD in electronic format to appropriate federal, state, and interstate resource agencies as well as Indian Tribes, local governments, and members of the public likely to be interested in the relicensing proceedings. A distribution list of all known potential stakeholders receiving copies of the NOI and PAD is attached.

NCPA intends to utilize the default Integrated Licensing Process (ILP) for relicensing.

To assist in open communications with potential stakeholders, where feasible, the Licensee plans to use electronic communications as a main source of communication. If electronic communication is not feasible, hard copy communication will be utilized as a secondary form of communication during the process. Documents filed with the Commission and provided to stakeholders will also be posted on NCPA's website at www.ncpahydro.com.

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The Commission will issue Scoping Document 1 (SD1) within 60 days of the filing date of the NOI and PAD. In addition, pursuant to 18 CFR § 5.8(b)(3)(viii), FERC will provide public notice and schedule a public scoping meeting and a Project site visit within 30 days of issuing SD1.

Under 18 CFR § 5.5(e), the Licensee formally requests to be designated as the Commission's non-federal representative in relicensing of the Collierville and Spicer Meadow Transmission Line Project (FERC No. 11197) for the purposes of consultation under Section 7 of the Endangered Species Act and the joint regulations under 50 CFR Part 402, and National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration under Section 305(b) of the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation and Management Act and implementing regulations at 50 CFR § 600.920, and Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act and the implementing regulations under 36 CFR Part 800.

4. Statement of Intent

Northern California Power Agency (NCPA) unequivocally intends to file an application for a subsequent license for the Collierville and Spicer Meadow Transmission Line Project (FERC No. 11197). NCPA intends to use the Commission's Integrated Licensing Process.

5. Principal Project Works and Project Description

Collierville Transmission Line

The Collierville Transmission Line extends 39.6 miles from the Collierville Powerhouse Switchyard to the PG&E Bellota Switchyard. It is a 230-kilovolt (kV) double circuit, three-phase, overhead transmission line. The Transmission Line is located within a 120-foot-wide right-of-way (ROW) and encompasses a total of 599.9 acres of private property, including 26.4 acres of land owned by USACE and 10.8 acres of land owned by the US Bureau of Land Management.

The transmission line is composed of three vertically configured, BlueJay 1113 KCMIL ACSR (45/7) conductors per circuit on 159 direct embed, weathered steel, mono pole structures with 133 single structures (straight sections); 11 single structures with guy wires (at slight angles); and 15 structure locations (at sharp angles) each composed of two monopoles with guy wires. The guy wires are anchored opposite the angle to provide additional support. At the 15 major corners, each circuit is on its own direct embed monopole structure with guy wires. The poles range in height from 60 to 95 feet.

Spicer Meadow Transmission Line

The Spicer Meadow Transmission Line extends 13.6 miles underground from the Spicer Meadow Powerhouse Switchyard to the PG&E Cabbage Patch Switchyard. It is a 21 kV, single circuit, three-phase, underground transmission line with three Type MV-90 35kV 4.0 (19x) conductors in a single conduit. The Transmission Line is located within a 10-foot-wide ROW and encompasses a total of 16.7 acres. The line also includes 60 underground electric vaults. The Transmission Line is located on 16.4 acres of federal lands and 0.3 acres of private lands within the Stanislaus National Forest in Calaveras and Tuolumne Counties.
